Interesting Civil War Facts for the month of July:

1861: July 21st First battle of the war occurs near Manassas, Virginia. It is known as the first battle of Manassas or Bull Run. Confederate General Joseph E. Johnston defeats Union General Irvin McDowell's green troops. July 27th Command of the Army of the Potomac is given to General George B. McClellan.

1862: July 11th Halleck becomes United States' General in Chief, July 22 Lincoln Shares his first draft of the Emancipation Proclamation with his cabinet.

1863: July 1-3 Battle of Gettysburg, Pennsylvania , July 4th Lee retreats from Gettysburg, Vicksburg surrenders, July 13th Draft riots in New York City,

1864 : July 12th Confederate Jubal Early's forces threaten Washington D.C. but then withdraw, July 22nd The Battle of Atlanta.

1865: July 7th Lincoln Assassination conspirators Mary Surratt, Lewis Powell, George Atzerodt, and David Harold are hanged in Washington D.C. John Surratt had fled to Canada to escape prosecution.

Recipe of the Month**Navy Bean Soup**

Soak the beans over night or for at least 8-12 hours before starting the recipe. Cook in cast iron for better flavor and an authentic re-enactment.

1 Cup (8oz) dried navy beans , 5 Cups of water, 1/2 pound of salt pork or slab bacon, 2 large carrots or 1 cup chopped
1 Large onion or 3/4 chopped, 1 Large potato, unpeeled, but cut into 1/2 inch pieces, 1 tsp. salt , 1/2 tsp. pepper

Wash the beans in a colander and pick out any discolored ones or pieces of dirt. Place the beans in a large stock pot or Dutch oven and allow to soak over night. Drain the beans and add 5 cups of water, salt pork, carrots and onions to the beans. Stir the mixture and bring to a boil, cover, reduce heat to a simmer and simmer the beans for at least 45 minutes or until tender. Add the chopped potatoes, salt, pepper. Bring to a boil cover and cook about 15 minutes or until the potatoes are fork tender.

Go about 1-1/2 miles turn right to parking lot less than a mile down the road, just short of the Canal.
